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Making Your Horse Rescuable.

Get your horse used to different stimuli.

Horses rely on their senses and they have very good memories.

Make ear plugs--use cotton balls in knee high nylons

Use Vick's in nostrils

Be able to lead your horse with it blindfolded.

Accustom your horse to leg handling

Use a cotton rope and swimming noodles around the legs to make hobbles.

Tow straps can be used to pull horses

1. Do Not Panic.
2. Make sure you are safe and the horse is safe to approach-- do not make matters worse
3. Develop a working relationship with your veterinarian

First Aid Kits for the Barn

1. Sterile telfa pads / gauze sponges
2. Leg wraps or chuck pads
3. Vetwrap
4. Duct tape
5. Petroleum jelly
6. Iodine scrub/solution
7. Twitch
8. Flashlight
9. Blunt-tipped Scissors
10. Rectal Thermometer - Digital
11. Wire cutters
12. Hoof pick
13. Large syringe or bulb syringe for flushing wound.

Additional medical items – kept inside in clean area.

Furacin ointment

Eye ointment

DMSO gel

Bute or Banamine paste

First Aid Kit for the Trail or Road

1. Sharp knife
 2. Cell phone
 3. Spares kit
- Hoof pick
Piece of leather latigo
Leather punch
